## What is a Birth Injury?

Birth injuries frequently result from preventable medical errors or inadequate care during pregnancy, labor, or delivery. These injuries may involve physical trauma, oxygen deprivation, untreated infections, or failures to timely diagnose and respond to medical emergencies.

## What Types of Birth Injury Cases Do We Handle?

### Cerebral Palsy and Acquired Brain Injuries

### **Spinal Cord Injuries and Physical Trauma**

Improper use of forceps or vacuum extractors, or mismanagement of difficult deliveries, can cause spinal cord injuries, fractures, and other forms of physical trauma. These injuries may significantly affect a child's mobility, physical development, and overall health.

### **Infections and Delayed Diagnosis**

Birth injuries can also result from untreated maternal or neonatal infections or from delays in diagnosing and responding to serious medical conditions after birth. Failures to recognize signs of infection, administer timely treatment, or escalate care can significantly worsen outcomes and lead to permanent injury or long-term health complications.

## **How Long Do You Have to File a Birth Injury Claim?**

Birth injury claims in Maryland are governed by a specific statute of limitations that accounts for injuries to minors.
