## What is Considered a Delayed Diagnosis?

A delayed diagnosis occurs when a doctor or other health care provider fails to diagnose a condition within a reasonable timeframe, despite symptoms, test results, or clinical signs that should have prompted timely action. When an illness progresses unchecked, patients may face more severe complications, more invasive treatment, or a reduced chance of recovery. Determining whether your condition should have been diagnosed earlier is often the first step in evaluating a potential medical negligence claim.

## What Are Common Types of Delayed Diagnosis Cases?

### Cancer

A delayed cancer diagnosis – from breast cancer to lung cancer to colorectal cancer – can allow the disease to progress to a more advanced stage, making treatment more difficult and reducing the chances of recovery.

### Heart Attack

Failing to promptly recognize heart attack symptoms can result in permanent heart damage or even death, especially when early intervention could have been lifesaving.

### Stroke

A delay in diagnosing a stroke can prevent patients from receiving critical treatments such as clot-busting medications, leading to severe neurological impairment.

## **Infections and Sepsis**

When infections are not identified early, they can rapidly worsen and lead to sepsis, a life-threatening condition requiring immediate medical attention.

## **Pulmonary Embolism**

A missed or delayed diagnosis of a pulmonary embolism can cause sudden respiratory failure or cardiac arrest.

## **Appendicitis**

Failure to diagnose appendicitis in time can result in a ruptured appendix, dangerous infection, and prolonged recovery.

## **Gastrointestinal Disorders**

Delayed diagnosis of conditions like Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis, or bowel obstructions can cause unnecessary pain, complications, and avoidable surgery.

## **When Is a Delayed Diagnosis Medical Malpractice in Maryland?**

A delayed diagnosis may be medical malpractice when a healthcare provider fails to meet the accepted standard of care, meaning they did not act as a reasonably competent provider would have under similar circumstances. This can include overlooking symptoms, failing to order appropriate tests, misreading imaging or lab results, or not following up on abnormal findings. When this lack of care causes a harmful delay in identifying and treating a condition, you may have grounds for a malpractice claim.

## **How to Prove a Delayed Diagnosis Claim in Maryland**
