## Maryland's Deadline for Filing a Motorcycle Accident Claim

In Maryland, individuals have three years to file a motorcycle accident lawsuit. However, there may be notice requirements and/or shorter deadlines depending on whether the claim involves a government entity. Seeking medical treatment as soon as possible after an accident can help protect both your health and any future motorcycle accident claim. It is also important not to wait too long before speaking with an attorney, as investigating the accident, gathering records, and dealing with insurance companies is a timely process.

## What Are the Common Causes of Motorcycle Accidents?

Most motorcycle accidents are a result of a driver failing to notice the motorcycle on the road. Distracted driving, failure to yield, speeding, and unsafe lane changes contribute to a large number of motorcycle crashes. Left-turn collisions are especially common.

Road conditions such as construction, debris, loose gravel, potholes, and uneven pavement pose additional dangers to motorcyclists. While this may seem minor to a standard vehicle, these issues can cause a motorcycle to lose control. In addition, heavy traffic around the Baltimore and Washington metropolitan areas, poor visibility, and weather conditions can increase the risk of an accident. In some cases, multiple factors contribute to how the accident occurred, making a detailed investigation important in any motorcycle accident case.

## What Are the Most Common Motorcycle Accident Injuries?

Motorcycle accident injuries are often severe because of the lack of protection drivers have during impact. Although Maryland has a universal mandatory helmet law, injuries may still require extensive treatment or long-term care.

Common motorcycle accident injuries include:

- Amputations
- Broken bones and fractures
- Burns and lacerations
- Concussions and head trauma
- Emotional trauma and PTSD
- Facial fractures
- Foot, knee, and leg injuries
- Internal bleeding
- Neck and back injuries

- Organ damage
- Permanent nerve damage
- Road rash and severe skin abrasions
- Shoulder injuries
- Spinal cord injuries
- Traumatic brain injuries

## What Are Your Compensation Options After a Motorcycle Accident?

Motorcycle accident victims may receive compensation for medical expenses, lost income, rehabilitation costs, future medical treatment, and property damage. In more serious cases, compensation may address long-term disability or reduced earning capacity if the injuries affect the person's ability to work in the future.

In Maryland, injured riders may seek additional compensation for pain and suffering. This may include emotional distress and disruptions caused by the accident. The claim depends on several factors, such as the severity of the injuries, the insurance coverage, and how the injuries affect daily life over time. It is important to keep documentation of all medical records and accident reports, as insurance companies try to minimize their payouts.

## Steps to Take After a Motorcycle Accident in Maryland

It is important to take all the necessary steps after an accident to protect your health and potential compensation later.

After a motorcycle accident, you should:

- Call 911 and report the accident
- Request medical attention, even if injuries seem minor
- Exchange contact and insurance information with the other driver
- Take photos of the scene, vehicle damage, injuries, road conditions, and traffic signs
- Speak with witnesses and obtain contact information if available
- Cooperate with law enforcement when accident reports are prepared
- Avoid discussing who is at fault at the scene
- Keep copies of medical records, receipts, and repair estimates
- Notify your insurance company that the accident occurred
- Do not give recorded statements to insurance companies without legal advice

Medical attention after an accident is important, especially since motorcycle injuries worsen over time or may not be diagnosed right away. Following treatment protocols and attending all appointments helps create a clear record of injuries and the recovery process.
